## Master Guitarist Anton Del Forno Brings Big Music to Small Setting

nton Del Forno brought concert hall mu-sic to the people on May 9 when he vis-tised the Waretown Branch of the Ocean County Library. With an audience of about 70 people in the small meeting room, Del Forno strummed away his concert hall music in an intimate setting. Del Forno's performance was arranged through a special outreach program titled "Bringing the Great Concert Music to the

This program is a family-oriented music program that offers libraries an opportunity to sponsor a concert hall presentation for their community to enjoy. World-renowned musicians like Del Forno set aside time to bring their music to the people so that they may enjoy criti-cally acclaimed performances.

For Del Forno, it is like bringing Carnegie

Hall to your hometown. Del Forno says he re alizes that there are so many people who will never have the opportunity to attend perfor-

mances at the hig concert halls.

Tom Safka of Little Egg Harbor says he takes advantage of the programs that the Ocean

County Library offers.
"I love Spanish classical music, and I'm curious to hear the music that he will play,"

Safta said, reading the concert program.

Del Forno says it is satisfying to come and play at small places like Waretown.

"It's a more informal setting, so people in the audience are able to ask questions and interact with me," he said.

Concertgoer Nolan Willence of Toms River is a classical musician himself. A trumpet player, Willence has played with the Atlantic Symphony Orchestra as well as with Arthur Fielder and the Boston Pops. Willence came to see Del Forno play at Waretown because be has taken up classical guitar for a third time willence, who played on Long Beach Island some 30 years ago, was excited for the chance to talk shop with another classical guitarist.

"Most guitarists don't play classical music, so I was thrilled when I heard Del Forno was going to be here," Willence said. Because of the intimate setting, Willence was able to dis-cuss the type of guitar he had just purchased, and got some tips from Del Forno on how to

Del Forno, hailed by critics as "The Master of Guitar," was born in New Jersey and raised in North Bergen. He picked up his first instrument, the steel string plectrum guitar, at the insistence of his father. Del Forno and his brother Ralph then formed the rock and roll brother Raiph then formed the rock and roll hand the "Orphans," and at age 14, Del Forno was playing in nightclubs weekly. A few years later, the band cut their first record and were on their way to rock and roll fame – until Del Forno, 17, heard the classical guitar and then

knew his destiny.

Del Forno abandoned the rock and roll guitar to become a classical musician. In 1972, he graduated from Mannes College of Music in New York with highest honors. At 24, the Sol Hurok Agency Isunched Del Forno on a successful concert career.

Del Forno's debut was at Carnegie Hall. Since then, he has performed at colleges, uni-versities and concert halls throughout the world. In addition to his concerts, Del Forno was featured as lead guitarist with the Joffre Ballet and the Metropolitan Opera, along with the Broad-way production of "Man of La Mancha." Del Forno's "In Concert Part II" won the

title of "Feature Album of the Week" on WQXR, the New York Times radio station. Del Forno's latest release, Del Forno plays Del Forno, which features all original compositions, is already winning critical acclaim. Following that success, Del Forno will be back in the recording studio soon to put together another

collection of his own compositions.

In addition to performing, Del Forno enjoys teaching young people about the guitar. Del Forno conducts workshops and masters classes. and is responsible for creating the guitar de-partment at St. John's University in New York.

Anthony Palmucci, director of The Music Academy in Toms River, has been a private stadent of Del Forno's for four years. Del Forno has instructed Palmucci in the classical and electric guitar.

"Anton always taught me to strive for excellence and keep playing no matter what hap-pens," Palmucci said. Palmucci carried Del Forno's instruments into the library and helped

the guitarist warm up for the concert.

Del Forno – teacher, composer and performer – was pleased to see children in the an-
